

84. NARRATIVE OF THE FACTUAL BASIS FOR PROBABLE CAUSE: The undersigned certifies and swears that he/she has just and reasonable grounds to believe that the heretofore named defendant did commit the violations of law as stated above and the factual basis for this belief is as follows:

Your Affiant is Inspector Brian K. Stagner of the Office of the Inspector General, Florida Department of Corrections.

Your Affiant has probable cause to believe Correctional Officer Shaniqua L. Jackson "(Officer Jackson)" in the County of Jackson and the State of Florida, did commit the following offenses:

One count of the criminal offense of Principal in the first degree to Introduction of Contraband into a State Correctional Institution (Controlled Substances), in violation of s. 777.011/944.47 (1)(a)(4) Fla. Stat., when Officer Jackson did actually and intentionally aid in the introduction, through unauthorized channels, into the secure perimeter of Apalachee Correctional Institution, multiple controlled substances defined in s. 893.02(4).

One count of the offense of Unlawful compensation or reward for official behavior, in violation of s. 838.016 (1), Fla. Stat., when Officer Jackson did receive money transfers to personally benefit Officer Jackson, for the nonperformance of her lawful duty, to wit: the overlooking, permitting, and/or enabling the violation of Florida criminal laws and Departmental disciplinary rules, as part of her prohibited personal relationship with an inmate.

One count of the offense of Delivery of a Controlled Substance, in violation of s. 893.13 (1)(a)(2) Fla. Stat., when Officer Jackson did actually, and intentionally deliver a controlled substance, "Ethylpentylone", a substituted cathinone class drug, to an Inmate Charles Roberts housed within Apalachee Correctional Institution on September 10, 2018. According to laboratory analysis of the substance it was identified as Ethylpentylone.

One count of the offense of Delivery of a Controlled Substance, in violation of s. 893.13 (1)(a)(2) Fla. Stat., when Officer Jackson did actually, and intentionally deliver a controlled substance, cannabis, to an Inmate Charles Roberts housed within Apalachee Correctional Institution on September 10, 2018. According to laboratory analysis of the substance it was identified as Cannabis.

One count of the offense of Delivery of a Controlled Substance, in violation of s. 893.13 (1)(a)(2) Fla. Stat., when Officer Jackson did actually, and intentionally deliver a controlled substance, alprazolam (Xanax), to an Inmate Charles Roberts housed within Apalachee Correctional Institution on September 10, 2018. The markings on the pills identify the substance as Xanax containing the active drug alprazolam.

On or about, August 1, 2018, Captain Derlous White ("Captain White") received a telephone call from an anonymous complainant indicating The caller indicated Officer Jackson was introducing contraband (drugs and cellular telephones) via the O-dormitory officer's station trash can. Once the contraband was placed in the trash can, it was retrieved and distributed by inmates. The caller advised Officer Jackson was receiving compensation via Western Union money transfers for her involvement in the introduction of contraband.

On or about September 10, 2018, Correctional Officer Shavon Brooks ("Officer Brooks") and Correctional Officer Breanna Cook ("Officer Cook") were assigned to O-dormitory. Both Officer Brooks and Officer Cook indicated in incident reports and sworn statements about suspicious behavior by Officer Jackson they observed on September 10, 2018. Both officers indicated on September 10, 2018, at approximately 2:30 a.m., Officer Jackson came into the O-dormitory officer's station to use the restroom. After using the restroom, Officer Jackson retrieved an empty brown paper bag from the officer's station and returned to P-dormitory where she was assigned. Officer Jackson returned to O-dormitory a short time later, again entered the O-dormitory officer's station restroom and retrieved the trash can. As Officer Jackson departed the officer's station, she placed the trash can in the wing two sally port and departed the dormitory. After Officer Jackson departed the dormitory, Inmate Charles Roberts, DC# 647942, ("Inmate Roberts"), went to the trash can and appeared to go through its contents, retrieve something, and placed object in his pants. After observing the suspicious behavior of Officer Jackson, Officer Cook notified Captain White.

Captain White reviewed the fixed wing video from the dormitory noting Inmate Roberts retrieved an object from the trash can, concealed it on his person, and returned to his assigned bunk. Captain White and Officer Cook searched Inmate Roberts' assigned bunk locating a brown paper bag containing suspected synthetic cannabinoid, suspected marijuana, suspected methamphetamine, and approximately 257 pills with marking consistent with Xanax. The drugs were packaged in cylindrical shaped parcels with plastic wrap and tape in a manner consistent with the introduction of contraband by insertion into a person's body cavities. The contraband was seized, photographed and packaged as evidence. The suspected drugs were forwarded to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement ("FDLE") for analysis. Per a report from FDLE the suspected methamphetamine was in fact "Ethylpentylone" a substituted cathinones class drug. The suspected marijuana was identified as cannabis. The other substances were not analyzed per FDLE policy.

During further review of the fixed wing video footage of the incident, Officer Jackson is seen on the wing two side of the dormitory assisting Officer Brooks wake up food service inmates. Officer Jackson is seen twice in close proximity to Inmate Roberts' assigned bunk.

Himage Riphasts provided a sworn recorded interview about his involvement in the incident. According to Inmate Roberts, between 2:30 a.m. and 3:30 a.m., Officer Jackson woke him up from sleeping in his assigned bunk. Officer Jackson told Inmate Roberts she was not working in his dorm and asked Inmate Roberts if he could hold a bag for her until she got back. Officer Jackson did not tell Inmate Roberts the intended recipient of the bag, but indicated it would be in the trash can. After leaving Inmate Roberts' bunk, Officer Jackson walked into the officer's station then exited the officers station with the trash can, leaving it in the sally port. Inmate Roberts went to the trash can and poured it out, retrieved the brown paper bag, placed it in his pants and walked back to his bunk. Inmate Roberts Indicated he had no knowledge what was in the bag when he retrieved it. Inmate Roberts indicated he held the bag for Officer Jackson because she had brought in cigarettes to him three different times in the past. Inmate Roberts advised Officer Jackson would give him five (5) packs of cigarettes at the time. Inmate Roberts indicated he paid Officer Jackson two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) cash for five (5) packs of cigarettes. Inmate Roberts advised Officer Jackson would pass them off through a brown paper bag in the trash can.

Following the September 10, 2018 incident, additional sworn testimony was obtained from an inmate witness indicating Officer Jackson was involved in a romantic and business relationship with Inmate Walter Holley, DC# L08450, ("Inmate Holley"), in the introduction of contraband. Testimony further indicated, Officer Jackson did not do anything unless directed to do so by Inmate Holley. Testimony indicated Officer Jackson was receiving financial compensation via Western Union, Ria Financial, and CashApp for her involvement in introducing contraband.

In an effort to further corroborate the inmate testimony, Inmate Holley's internal housing movements were reviewed and compared to Officer Jackson's post assignments. According to FDC records, Inmate Holley was housed at Apalachee Correctional Institution from January 5, 2017, through January 22, 2018. While housed at Apalachee Correctional Institution, Inmate Holley was frequently assigned to O-dormitory where Officer Jackson was assigned to work.

Based on the statements and evidence gathered, subpoenas duces tecum were forwarded to Western Union, MoneyGram, Ria Financial, and Square Inc. (CashApp) to further investigate the allegations Officer Jackson was receiving compensation for her involvement in introducing contraband into Apalachee Correctional Institution.

Western Union records were provided in response to subpoena. Those records indicate between April 5, 2018, and June 26, 2018, Officer Jackson received money transfers from family members of Inmate Holley. The sender information was verified as relatives of Inmate Holley's based on their names and/or, their dates of birth, addresses, telephone number, and driver's license numbers. Details of those records are as follows:

According to Western Union, on or about April 5, 2018, Officer Jackson received a money transfer from "Chevella Isaac (Harry)" for \$380.00. On or about April 21, 2018, Officer Jackson received another money transfer from "Chevella Harry (Isaac)" for \$500.00. A review of Inmate Holley's visitation records indicates the sender "Chevella Isaac" is his sister.

In her sworn digitally recorded telephonic statement on February 17, 2021, Chevella Harry indicated she has sent money for Inmate Walter Holley in the past. Ms. Harry could not recall sending money to Shaniqua Jackson. Ms. Harry indicated her brother, Inmate Holley, would contact her and request money to be sent to friends and she would send them her own money. Ms. Harry did not recall the purpose for the money. Ms. Harry did not know Shaniqua Jackson was a Correctional Officer.

On or about April 18, 2018, Officer Jackson received a money transfer from "Venester Isaac" for \$1340.00. According to Inmate Holley's visitation records, "Vanester Isaac" is his mother.

In her sworn digitally recorded telephonic statement on February 16, 2021, Vanester Isaac indicated she recalled sending some money for her son, Corey Isaac to someone named Jackson. Ms. Isaac did not recall the purpose for the money. Ms. Isaac did not know Shaniqua Jackson was a Correctional Officer.

Between April 25, 2018, and June 26, 2018, Officer Jackson received ten (10) money transfers from "Corey Issac" totaling \$3357.00. According to Inmate Holley's visitation records, "Corey Issac" is his brother. The telephone number provided by sender, Corey Issac is 561-846-0629. This telephone number relates to the following information provided by Square Inc. (CashApp) and money transfers received by Officer Jackson.

In his sworn digitally recorded telephonic statement on February 24, 2021, Corey Isaac indicated he did recall sending two (2) money transfers to someone named "Jackson" in 2017, or 2018. Mr. Isaac could not recall the first name of the female he sent money. Mr. Isaac stated he never met Ms. Jackson. The amount of these transfers was \$700.00 and \$600.00. Mr. Isaac did not know what the money was being used for. When questioned about the multiple transactions documented in this investigation, he couldn't recall sending that many transactions.

In addition to the aforementioned Western Union records, Officer Jackson received an additional seven money transfers, totaling \$2463.00, in 2017, from Inmate Holley's family while Inmate Holley was still housed at Apalachee Correctional Institution.

In response to subpoena, Square Inc. provided records related to Officer Jackson's CashApp account. Square records indicate, Officer Jackson received fifteen (15) money transfers from sender, "Corey" between July 1, 2018, and October 3, 2018. The sum of the money transfers received by Officer Jackson from sender Corey total \$6465.00.

Telephone number 561-846-0629, provided in the Square records for Corey Issac by Western Union, was queried in CashApp and found it linked to account "Corey" with cashtag "\$1Tubster." The CashApp account also includes a profile picture that matches the profile picture of Corey Issac's public Facebook profile. A review of Corey Issac's public Facebook profile includes a post from September 15, 2020, of an image of Inmate Holley with the quote, "Just want to say Happy B-day to my Lil Bra Wally aka Soja." Based on the information from Square Inc. and Corey Issac's Facebook profile, the money transfers to Officer Jackson for "Corey" are from Inmate Holley's brother, Corey Issac.

On February 26, 2021, Senior Inspector Julian Basford and Inspector Brian K. Stagner made contact with former Officer Shaniqua Jackson at Ms. Jackson was advised she was not being detained and could ask us to leave at any time. When questioned about the introduction of contraband on September 10, 2018, at Apalachee Correctional Institution, Ms. Jackson denied bringing in contraband. She stated no matter what dormitory she was in, if the trash was full she would bring it out for an inmate to empty. When question about Inmate Roberts statement about she was the one who gave him the contraband, she stated "He is just an inmate."

Ms. Jackson denied being in a relationship with Inmate Walter Holley. She indicated she didn't even remember is identity. She denied knowledge of Inmate Holley's tattoo of "Shaniqua."

Ms. Jackson denied receiving money from any inmates. Ms. Jackson could not recall receiving Corey Isaac, Chevella Harry or Vanester Isaac. She indicated any money she received was for her brother, Shedrick Jackson and his businesses Infinity Flooring or Front Street Renovation.

Based on the testimony and evidence obtained during this investigation, Correctional Officer Shaniqua Jackson cultivated a personal and business relationship with Inmate Walter Holley while Inmate Holley was housed at Apalachee Correctional Institution and Officer Jackson was an officer. The relationship involved the introduction of contraband into Apalachee Correctional Institution and the receiving of money transfers from Inmate Holley's family. As evidenced through the money transfers, Officer Jackson continued to profit from her illegal relationship with Inmate Holley and continued her participation in the introduction of contraband into Apalachee Correctional Institution even after Inmate Holley was transferred to another institution as evidenced by the events of September 10, 2018.

Your Affiant respectfully submits probable cause has been established that Correctional Officer Shaniqua L. Jackson did commit one count of the criminal offense of Principal in the first degree to Introduction of Contraband into a State Correctional Institution (Controlled Substances), in violation of s. 777.011/944.47 (1)(a)(4) Fla. Stat., when Officer Jackson did actually and intentionally aid in the introduction, through unauthorized channels, into the secure perimeter of Apalachee Correctional Institution, controlled substances defined in s. 893.02(4), when she delivered contraband items packaged consistent with the common practices for introducing contraband into the trash can in O-dormitory at Apalachee Correctional Institution for Inmate Charles Roberts to retrieve.

Your Affiant respectfully submits probable cause has been established that Correctional Officer Shaniqua L. Jackson did commit one count of the offense of Unlawful compensation or reward for official behavior, in violation of s. 838.016 (1), Fla. Stat., when Officer Jackson did receive money transfers to personally benefit Officer Jackson, for the nonperformance of her lawful duty, to wit: the overlooking, permitting, and/or enabling the violation of Florida criminal laws and Departmental disciplinary rules, as part of her prohibited personal relationship with an inmate, and for her past, present and/or future participation in the introduction of contraband into Apalachee Correctional Institution, when Officer Jackson received (28) money transfers during calender year 2018, totaling \$12,042.00, from relatives of Inmate Walter Holley.

Your Affiant respectfully submits probable cause has been established that Correctional Officer Shaniqua L. Jackson did commit one count of the offense of Delivery of a Controlled Substance, in violation of s. 893.13 (1)(a)(2) Fla. Stat., when Officer Jackson did actually and intentionally deliver a controlled substance, "Ethylpentylone", a substituted cathinone class drug, to an inmate housed within Apalachee Correctional Institution by placing a quantity of the substance in a trash can in a manner Inmate Charles Roberts could retrieve it.

Your Affiant respectfully submits probable cause has been established that Correctional Officer Shaniqua L. Jackson did commit one count of the offense of Delivery of a Controlled Substance, in violation of s. 893.13 (1)(a)(2) Fla. Stat., when Officer Jackson did actually and intentionally deliver a controlled substance, cannabis, to an inmate housed within Apalachee Correctional Institution by placing a quantity of the substance in a trash can in a manner Inmate Charles Roberts could retrieve it.

Your Affiant respectfully submits probable cause has been established that Correctional Officer Shaniqua L. Jackson did commit one count of the offense of Delivery of a Controlled Substance, in violation of s. 893.13 (1)(a)(2) Fla. Stat., when Officer Jackson did actually and intentionally deliver a controlled substance, alprazolam (Xanax), to an inmate housed within Apalachee Correctional Institution by placing a quantity of the substance in a trash can in a manner Inmate Charles Roberts could retrieve it.

Your Affiant requests an arrest warrant be issued for SHANIQUA L. JACKSON, DOB
for one count each of a violation of s. 777.04/944.47 (1)(a)(4), the laws related to principle to introducing contraband communication, a violation of s. 838.016(1), the laws relating to unlawful compensation, a violation of 944.39 the law relating to the interference with prisoners, and three counts of a violation of s. 893.13 (1)(a)(2) the laws relating to the delivery of a controlled substance. Your Affiant is Inspector Brian K. Stagner of the Office of the Inspector General, Florida Department of Corrections.
