There is probable cause that Taylor Leigh Miller has committed crimes in Holmes County, Florida, including the offense(s) introduction of contraband into a State Correctional Institution, to wit: Tobacco/Nicotine; Introduction / Removal of contraband into a State Correctional Institution, to wit: hand written communication; Unlawful Compensation; Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband into a State Correctional Facility to wit: Cellular telephone's; Unlawful use of two way communication; and Interference with prisoners. You are to bring her before me to answer a complaint charging her with each of the following:

84. NARRATIVE OF THE FACTUAL BASIS FOR PROBABLE CAUSE: The undersigned certifies and sweeps that he/she has just and responsible grounds to balleve that the hereforce named defendant did commit the violations of law as stated above and the factual basis for this bailet is as follows:

Your Affiant is Inspector William "Eddie" Dalton of the Office of the Inspector General, Florida Department of Corrections.

Your Affiant has probable cause to believe that on or about August 2020 through November 2020, Vocational Food Service Coordinator, Taylor Miller, did commit the criminal offence of Introduction of Contraband Into a State Correctional Institution (1 count), in violation of § 944.47 (1) (a)(4), to wit: tobacco, which contains the stimulant nicotine; Taylor Miller, did commit the criminal offence of Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband (1 count), in violation of §777.04 (3) / 944.47 (1)(a)(6), Florida Statute, to wit: cellular telephones; Taylor Miller, did commit the criminal offence of Unlawful Compensation (43 counts), in violation of § 838.016 (1), Florida Statute, when Taylor Miller did receive (43) money transfers to personally benefit Taylor Miller, for the non-performance of her lawful duty, to wit: the overlooking, permitting, and/or enabling the violation of Florida criminal laws and Departmental disciplinary rules, including engaging in a prohibited personal relationship with immales; Taylor Miller, did commit the criminal offence of Removal of Contrabend (hand written communication) (1 count), in violation of § 944.47 (1) (a) (1) Florida Statute, when Taylor Miller did actually and intentionally receive and removed unauthorized written communication from immates; Taylor Miller, did commit the criminal offence of Unlawful Use of a two-way communication Device (1 count), in violation of § 934.215, Florida Statute, when Taylor Miller did utilize her personal cellular telephone to transmit conversation, text messages, images and/or videos to contraband cellular telephone(s) in the possession of immates; Taylor Miller, did commit the criminal offence of interference with Prisoners (1 count), in violation of § 944,39, Florida Statute, when Taylor Miller began a personal relationship with immates while said immates were under the care, custody, and control of the Florida Department of Corrections.

On November 22, 2020, Captain Dustin Jordan, Captain James Mann, Captain Justin McDowell, and Senjor Inspector William Delton conducted a canine contraband interdiction operation at Holmes Correctional institution. At approximately 11:00 a.m., nercotics certified canine "Judd" alerted to the odor of narcotics emanating from a silver in color Chevrolet Spark bearing Florida tag number This vehicle was identified as belonging to Vocational Food Service Coordinator Taylor Miller.

Senior inspector Dalton made contact with the owner of the above listed vehicle, Taylor Miller DOB-Senior inspector Dalton advised Taylor Miller of the K9 alert and requested consent to search her vehicle pursuant to a criminal investigation. Taylor Miller gave Senior Inspector Dalton verbal consent (captured on post-Miranda sworn statement as well) to search her vehicle.

Upon a search of Taylor Miller's vehicle, marijuana shake was located throughout the interior of the vehicle. A "KITE" (note from an Inmate) was also located in Taylor Miller's purse along with several rolls of black tape, empty 305 cigarette boxes, and unopened condoms. All Items were photographed for evidentiary purposes.

On November 22, 2020, Taylor Miller provided a digitally recorded post-Miranda swom statement advising she has worked at Holmes Correctional institution as a Vocational Food Service Coordinator since January 2020. Taylor Miller advised she has worked in food service at Holmes Correctional Institution as well as Holmes Correctional Institution Work Camp.

Taylor Miller Indicated her father has a dispensary. Ms. Taylor further stated her	medical marijuana card and uses her vehicle to make frequent trips to the marijuana father also smokes marijuana in her vehicle.
When asked about the letter that was k	ocated in her purse. Taylor Miller advised
According to Taylor Miller, soon after star Miller burshed and stated	rting her employment with Holmes Correctional Institution, she advised When asked how many clearattes Taylor Miller Introduced Illegally to Inmates. Taylor

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Records were obtained through subpoens duce tocum from Square Inc. the marketing company of the money transfer app, Cash App, for records related to Taylor Miller, date of birth

According to Square Inc. records, three (3) accounts were identified associated with Taylor Miller. Cash App accounts Taylor Miller / Bae Bae, Lestle Goddin and Meliesa Carter, despite having different identity verification names, each account had Taylor Miller's date of birth Last four of SSN: and addresses and addresses

The account holder information provided by Square Inc. matches information Taylor Miller provided your Affiant and on file with the Florida Department of Corrections.

Based on Square records, your Affiant was able to identify from August 2020 through September 2020, Cash App "Leslie Goddin" (Taylor Miller) received twenty-five (25) Cash App money transactions, totaling three thousand seven hundred twenty-six dollars (\$3,726.00) that were received from inmates, inmates' families, or known associates of inmates.

Based on Square records, your Affant was able to identify from October 2020 through November 2020. Cash App Melissa Carter (Taylor Miller) received eighteen (18) Cash App money transactions, totaling five thousand seven hundred fifty-one dollars (\$5,751.00) that were received from inmates, inmates' families, or known associates of inmates.

While reviewing Cash App accounts, Taylor Miller's, Leslie Goddin's and Melissa Carter's accounts, thirty (30) Cash App accounts were identified associated with inmates and/or the associates of the Immates who were all housed at Holmes Correctional Institution when the money transfers were sent and while Taylor Miller was employed as a Vocational Food Service Coordinator. Of the thirty accounts identified, two (2) accounts were associated with two Immates that were housed at Holmes Correctional Institution.

Through experience in conducting similar investigations, your Affiant has knowledge inmates housed in the Florida Department of Corrections often maintain and operate their own Cash App accounts using contraband cellular telephones. The inmate maintained Cash App accounts are linked to typical bank accounts often opened with assistance of the inmates' friends, family, and/or associates.

During the course of this investigation, sworn testimony was obtained from cooperating inmates, inmates' family, or known associates of inmates. Their testimony indicated money transfers to Cash App "Melissa Carter" and "Leslie Goddin" were payments for various purposes including, but not limited to, the purchase and use of contraband cellular telephones, payment for protection within the facility, or for circumventing the authorized procedure for inmates to purchase carteen.

After reviewing records associated with Cash App account Taylor Miller / Bae Bae (\$tmili2918), transactions were identified between Taylor Miller and her family members. No transactions sent to this account were identified from inmates. Based on the records provided, it appears Taylor Miller received money transfers from inmates to the Melisse Carter and Leslie Goddin Cash App accounts, then transferred those funds to her Taylor Miller / Bae Bae account.

Based on the evidence compiled in this investigation, your Affant submits probable cause is established that the defendant, Taylor Miller, engaged in multiple personal relationships with inmates housed within the secure perimeter of Holmes Correctional Institution. While engaged in these relationships, Taylor Miller used several texting applications to send and receive electronic communication with inmates, who are responsible for money transfers received by Taylor Miller. As part of her relationships with inmates, Taylor Miller has received fourth-three (43) Cash App money transfers totaling approximately \$9,477.00 dollars as payment for various services, items, and acts, but all to personally benefit Taylor Miller. If not for Taylor Miller's failure to perform her lawful duties as a food service employee as outlined in Florida Administrative Code and the Florida Department of Corrections Employee Handbook, specifically related to Staffinnate/Offender Relationships, Taylor Miller would not have been personally compensated directly by Inmates and/or their associates, During the commission of the aforementioned crimes, Taylor Miller has repeated permitted and continuously overlooked numerous violations of Florida Department of Corrections Policies, Florida Administrative Code, and Florida Statute by Inmates under her supervision and while doing so interfered with the discipline and good conduct of multiple inmates housed at Holmes Correctional Institution.

Your Affant, requests an arrest warrant be issued for Taylor Miller, W/F, DOB address:
for one count (1) of introduction of Contraband Into a State Correctional Institution, in violation of Florida Statute § 944.47
(1) (a)(4) to wit: nicotine (stimulant), one count (1) of Conspiracy to Introduce Contraband, in violation of Florida Statute §777.04 (3)
/ 944.47 (1)(a)(5), to wit: cellular telephones, forty-three counts (43) of Unlawful Compensation by a public servant, in violation of Florida Statute §838.016 (1), one count (1) of Removal of Contraband from a State Correctional Institution, in violation of Florida Statute §844.67 (1)(a)(1) to wit: Unauthorized written communication, one count (1) of Unlawful Use of a two-way communication device, in violation of Florida Statute § 934.215, and one count (1) of interference with Prisoners, in violation of Florida Statute § 944.39.

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
