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I. AUTHORITY

The Florida Department of Corrections, Office of the Inspector General, by designation of the Secretary and § 944.31, Florida Statutes, is authorized to conduct any criminal investigation that occurs on property owned or leased by the department or involves matters over which the department has jurisdiction.

The testimony references included in this report are summations of oral or written statements provided to inspectors. Statements contained herein do not necessarily represent complete or certified transcribed testimony, except as noted. Unless specifically indicated otherwise, all interviews with witnesses, complainants, and subjects were audio or video recorded.

II. METHODOLOGY

The investigation reviewed the derivations of the allegation advanced by the complainant. The scope of this investigation does not seek to specifically address tort(s), but violations of criminal statutes. The criterion used to evaluate each contention or allegation was limited to the following standard of analysis:

1. Did the subject's action or behavior violate Florida criminal statutes?

III. ANALYSIS

The standard and analysis in this investigation is predicated with the burden of proving any violation of law, established by probable cause. The evidence considered for analysis is confined to the facts and allegations stated or reasonably implied. The actions or behavior of the subject are presumed to be lawful and in compliance with the applicable Florida law, unless probable cause indicates the contrary.

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IV. DEFINITIONS

Unfounded:

Refers to a disposition of a criminal case for which probable cause does not exist to suggest the suspect's behavior or action occurred nor is an arrest or formal charge being initiated.

Closed by Arrest:

Refers to a disposition of a criminal case for which probable cause exists that an identified subject committed the offense and one for which an arrest or formal prosecution has been initiated.

Exceptionally Cleared:

Refers to a disposition of a criminal case for which probable cause exists that an identified suspect committed the offense, but one for which an arrest or formal charge is not initiated, or in the case of a death investigation, one for which no evidence exists that the death was the result of a crime or neglect.

Open-Inactive:

Refers to a disposition of a criminal case for which a criminal investigation commenced, but where evidence is insufficient to close as unfounded, closed by arrest, or exceptionally cleared.

Investigative Assist Closed

Refers to a disposition of an investigative assist, where the conduct being investigated by the outside agency did not concern allegations against a Department employee, contractor, inmate, offender, or other person either employed or under the supervision of the Department.

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V. PREDICATE

On or about 11 December 2017 the Department of Corrections, Office of the Inspector General, received information indicating that Inmate Christopher Spence (E01712 W/M 05/17/1980) was discovered in cell B3208 at Tomoka Correctional Institution on 11 December 2017 at 2240 hours. At 2305 hours on 11 December 2017, Inmate Spence was pronounced deceased by In accordance with the active Memorandum of Understanding, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) assumed the investigative lead for this In-Custody Death investigation on 11 December 2017; Case Agent: Special Agent Jonathan Stephens.

VI. SUMMARY OF INVESTIGATIVE FINDINGS

Based on the exhibits, witnesses' testimony, subject officer's statements, and the record as a whole, presented or available to the primary inspector, the following findings of fact were determined:

Initial Response

At 2330 hours on 11 December 2017, this inspector was contacted by On-call Inspector Supervisor Katouree Jackson to respond to Tomoka Correctional Institution due to an in-custody inmate death investigation / FDLE Case Assist. Because the decedent was an open population inmate that expired from an unknown cause and manner, this inspector was advised that the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) would be responding, in accordance with the most current Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Florida Department of Corrections and the FDLE.

At 2332 hours, a brief background review of the decedent, Inmate Christopher Spence (E01712 W/M 05/17/1980) determined that he arrived in the Florida Department of Corrections on a commitment of fifteen (15) cumulative years for Grand Theft Motor Vehicle, Trafficking in Stolen Property [3 counts], Providing False Information to a Pawnbroker / <\$300 [2 counts], and Burglary of an Occupied Dwelling or Conveyance [2 counts] on 27 November 2006. Inmate Spence had a Tentative Release Date (TRD) of 20 March 2021. A review of the Corrections Data Center (CDC) database determined that Inmate Spence had at the time of his expiration.



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Due to the confined space within the crime scene, the FDLE Special Agents and the Medical Examiner's Investigator conducted the examination and secured the decedent for transport. *Cell B3208 was retained as a secured crime scene pending further investigative efforts.* The decedent was transported to the Medical Examiner's Office at approximately 0500 hours.

Special Agents Hubbard and Stephens conducted staff interviews from 0539 to 0750 hours.

At 0800 hours, this inspector assisted Special Agent Hubbard with an inspection of the decedent's personal property.

At 0840 hours, all FDLE Special Agents departed Tomoka Correctional Institution. This inspector relayed final instructions to Management, turned in issued communications equipment, and departed at 0915 hours. On-call Inspector Supervisor Katouree Jackson and District 7 Inspector Supervisor Dennis McIntosh were provided with an update of progress.

Release of Decedent Medical Information On 13 December 2017, this inspector provided SA Stephens with the required Inmate Spence's Stephens returned the completed and signed forms at

0907 hours on 14 December 2017.

On 18 December 2017, after clearance from Special Agent Stephens, cell B3208 was released to Management for routine occupation and use. Also on 18 December 2017, SA Stephens received Inmate Spence's medical records from Inspector Jonathan Warren at Tomoka Correctional Institution.

<u>Authorization to Return Confined Inmates to Population</u>

On 22 December 2017, SA Stephens cleared Inmate Alan Taylor for release from Administrative Confinement status. He additionally authorized the final disposition and release of any unrecovered property from cell B3208.

Authorization for Decedent Property Release

On 27 December 2017, Special Agent David Hubbard authorized the release of the decedent's property to his next of kin.

Investigative Follow-up

On 17 January 2018 and 16 March 2018, this inspector initiated a follow-up contact with SA Stephens concerning the disposition of FDLE case number OR-37-0072. The final Medical Examiner's report was pending.

FDLE Case Disposition and OIG Review

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On 15 June 2018, a digital copy of FDLE case number OR-37-0072 was delivered to Inspector Warren at Tomoka Correctional Institution pending this inspector's return from extended leave.

On 06 August 2018, this inspector conducted a comprehensive review of OR-37-0072. It was noted that Special Agent Stephens utilized multiple avenues beyond the resources of the District 7 Medical Examiner's Office to determine the presence in the evidentiary items recovered from cell B3208, with negative or inconclusive results.

The Florida Department of Law Enforcement determined no Probable Cause to extend criminal charges to any party.

No administrative deficiencies were determined during the course of this investigation and further action is not anticipated.

VII. CHARGES List alleged violations of Florida Law:

No evidence of any criminal or administrative violations was determined and no charges are anticipated.

VIII. CONCLUSION

Inspector Napier reviewed the investigation completed by FDLE, and administrative issues were not identified.

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
